	Judge Lee's spouse is a director and an attorney of Vandeberg Johnson, a     Tacoma law firm that employs 20 attorneys and 20 non-attorney employees. Her     spouse's ownership interest in the firm is less than 10%.
	Judge Lee said that Vandeberg Johnson, operates in a partnership capacity with the Seattle law firm of Cowan Gandara, and together the two separate firms operate as Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara. Her spouse is a director with Vandeberg Johnson (the Tacoma firm) and not the collective partnership.
	Judge Lee stated that she has no involvement with Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara. She said that she has no knowledge or access to any information about the customers of the firm.
	Judge Lee is also requesting a renewal of a reporting modification that would exempt her from disclosing her personal residential address information, including street address, parcel number, or legal description, on her Personal Financial Affairs Statement for 2012.
	Judge Lee stated that as a Pierce County Superior Court Judge, she hears cases that deal with civil, criminal (including felony criminal proceedings), and juvenile matters.
	Judge Lee stated that disclosure of her residential address puts herself and her family at risk of physical harm as a result of her current and past judicial decisions.

Filer was made aware in the course of presiding over a case assigned to Filer's docket in 2011that Filer's spouse had listed as clients the following school districts: Anacortes, Bethel, Bremerton, Clover Park, and Tacoma. This listing was apparently secured by a litigant from a non-public source and presented to the Filer in the course of litigation. No information regarding amount of fees paid was included. Filer was not aware of this information prior to it being presented during the course of the litigation.

Filer's spouse is an attorney and director at Vandeberg Johnson, a law firm with approximately 20 attorneys and approximately 20 non-attorney employees. The firm is located in Tacoma, Washington. The firm represents clients in business, real estate, estate planning, litigation and municipal matters. Vandeberg Johnson operates in a partnership capacity with the Seattle law firm of Cowan Gandara. Together, the two separate firms practice as Vandeberg, Johnson & Gandara. The Filer's spouse is only a director of the Tacoma half of the partnership. The hardship that is created by the disclosure requirement comes from the Rules of Professional Conduct ("RPC") 1.6, which prohibits the disclosure of information relating to the representation of a client, including the amounts paid by clients to their attorneys. Requiring the Filer to have the Filer's spouse and his firm to disclose the information required by the PDC could expose Vandeberg Johnson or its individual attorneys to disciplinary action by the Washington State Bar Association based on a violation of RPC 1.6.

See above. Other than the information provided above, Filer has no other personal knowledge.

On May 24, 2012, the application of Linda C.J. Lee, Post Office Box 88010, Steilacoom, Washington 98388, for a modification of the reporting requirements of RCW 42.17.241<sup>1</sup> was brought before the Public Disclosure Commission.

Consideration of the request was made pursuant to RCW 42.17A.120<sup>2</sup> and chapter 390-28 WAC by the Commission. The proceedings were held in Room 206, Evergreen Plaza Building, 711 Capitol Way, Olympia, Washington, 98504. The applicant, Linda C.J. Lee, by modification application, requested renewal of the reporting modification that would exempt her from disclosing her personal residential address information, including street address, parcel number, or legal description, on her Personal Financial Affairs Statement for 2011 Judge Lee also requested renewal of the reporting modification that would exempt her from disclosing the business and other governmental customers that paid \$10,000 or more during 2011 to Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara, LLP, a law firm.

The Commission was provided with a certification from Judge Lee waiving her personal appearance at the hearing and stating that the facts contained in the request are true and accurate.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

Based upon the Modification Application, the Commission makes the following Findings of Fact:

- 1. Judge Lee has previously been granted the requested reporting modification, the most recent being Order No. 2998.
- 2. Judge Lee is an elected Superior Court Judge for Pierce County. Her current term of office expires in December 2012.
- 3. Judge Lee stated that as a Pierce County Superior Court Judge, she hears cases that deal with civil, criminal (including felony criminal proceedings), and juvenile matters. She stated that disclosure of her residential address puts herself and her family at risk of physical harm as a result of her current and past judicial decisions.
- 4. Judge Lee's spouse, Mark Hood, is a director and attorney for Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara, LLP, a Tacoma law firm that employs 20 attorneys and 20 non-attorney employees. Her spouse's ownership interest in the firm is less than 10%.

- 5. Judge Lee said that Vandeberg Johnson operates in a partnership capacity with the Seattle law firm of Cowan Gandara, and together the two separate firms operate as Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara. Her spouse is a director with Vandeberg Johnson (the Tacoma firm) and not the collective partnership.
- 6. Judge Lee stated that she has no involvement with Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara and has no knowledge or access to any information about the customers of the firm.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

Having made these Findings of Fact, the Commission makes the following Conclusions of Law:

- 1. Literal compliance with all the provisions of the reporting requirements of RCW 42.17.241<sup>3</sup> would work a manifestly unreasonable hardship on the applicant.
- 2. Limited suspension or modification of the reporting requirements as specified in the Order would not frustrate the purposes of the Act in this particular case.

#### **ORDER**

Having made these Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Commission issues the following Order:

For the Statement of Personal Financial Affairs required to be filed with the Public Disclosure Commission between January 1 and April 16, 2012:

- 1. The applicant may satisfy the reporting requirements of RCW 42.17.241(1)(j)<sup>3</sup> with respect to her personal residence by providing the assessed value, creditor information, payment terms, security given and mortgage amount codes.
- 2. The applicant shall report all payments made by the Pierce County Superior Court to Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara, LLP.
- 3. The applicant may satisfy the reporting requirements of RCW 42.17.241(1)(g)(ii)<sup>3</sup> without disclosing the reportable business and other governmental customers of Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara, LLP, except that she must disclose the reportable information of which she is aware.
- 4. The applicant shall disclose the reportable business and other governmental customers or clients of Vandeberg Johnson and Gandara, LLP, whose identities are known to the applicant and whose interests are significantly affected by the Pierce County Superior Court, to the extent not otherwise disclosed in (2) and (3).
- 5. In all other matters required to be reported, the applicant shall comply in full with the reporting requirements of RCW 42.17/42.17A.
