This case involves alleged violations by Gina Tveit, a candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge of: (1) failing to timely file a Candidate Registration within two weeks of receiving an in-kind contribution; (2) failing to timely file a C-3 report, C-4 reports, and orders placed; (3) accepting an in-kind contribution that exceeded contribution limits; and (4) failing to file contribution and expenditure reports using the required electronic method.

I. JURISDICTION

 The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A RCW, the state campaign finance and disclosure laws; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC. These charges incorporate the Report of Investigation and all related exhibits by reference.

II. ALLEGATIONS

- 2. PDC staff alleges that Gina Tveit, a 2014 Stevens County District Court Judge, violated RCW 42.17A as follows:
 - 1) RCW 42.17A.205 by failing to timely file a Candidate Registration (C-1 report) within two weeks of becoming a candidate, after receiving the benefit of an in-kind contribution for opposition research (100 days late);
 - 2) RCW 42.17A.235, and .240 by failing to timely file the June 2014 C-4 report, with expenditures totaling \$6,551 (32 days late); by failing to timely file a C-3 report disclosing a \$24,791 contribution from the candidate (119 days late); by failing to timely file C-4 reports of Contributions and Expenditures disclosing

\$24,791 in expenditures (54–97 days late); and a \$4,500 in-kind contribution at least 265 days late); and by failing to report orders placed totaling \$22,113 (111 days late);

- 3) RCW 42.17.405 by accepting an in-kind contribution that exceeded contribution limits by \$2,600; and
- 4) RCW 42.17A.245 by failing to file contribution and expenditure reports using the required electronic method.

III. FACTS

- 3. Ms. Tveit was elected Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 2, 2010 general election. On May 24, 2014, Ms. Tveit filed a C-1 report registering her candidacy for re-election in 2014. Ms. Tveit was elected Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 4, 2014 general election.
- 4. Gary Ghramm, Ms. Tveit's father, engaged the services of Ted Pulver, a private investigator, to investigate Michael Clay, Ms. Tveit's 2014 opponent, sometime in January 2014. Ms. Tveit acknowledged that her father would not have engaged Mr. Pulver's services, except for the fact that Mr. Clay was a potential candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge.
- 5. Ms. Tveit was aware of her father's activities, and was therefore required to file a C-1, registering her candidacy, within two weeks of the date she was informed of his activities, or by no later than February 13, 2014. She filed a candidate registration 100 days late on May 24, 2014.
- 6. The value of Mr. Ghramm's in-kind contribution was \$4,500. Because the contribution limit to Ms. Tveit's campaign was \$1,900 per election, Ms. Tveit accepted an over-limit in-kind contribution in the amount of \$2,600.

- 7. The Campaign received monetary and in-kind contributions totaling \$46,679, with an equal amount of expenditures. Of this amount, Ms. Tveit contributed \$40,207 in personal funds which represented 86.5 percent of all contributions received.
- 8. The Campaign filed its June 2014 C-4 report, due July 10, 2014, 32 days late, on August 11, 2014. The report included expenditures totaling \$6,551, of which \$6,182 was for political advertising materials.
- 9. The Campaign failed to timely file a C-3 report disclosing the receipt of \$24,791 in personal funds from Ms. Tveit on October 1, 2014. The Campaign was required to file a C-3 report disclosing receipt of this contribution by October 6, 2014, but did not report receipt of the contribution until February 2, 2015, 119 days late and nearly three months after the 2014 general election. The late-reported contribution represented 53.1 percent of all contributions received by the Campaign.
- 10. The Campaign failed to file its 7-day Pre-General election C-4 report, which was due by October 28, 2014, and its Post-General election C-4 report, which was due by December 10, 2014, until February 2, 2015. The report covered the period October 14 through December 10, 2014, and disclosed previously unreported activities undertaken by the Campaign prior to the election. The 7-day C-4 report was filed 97 days late, and the Post-General election C-4 report was filed 54 days late. The late reported activities included:
 - 1) \$24,791 monetary contribution from Ms. Tveit's personal funds;
 - 2) \$24,791 in campaign expenditures for political advertising that included direct mail pieces, newspaper advertisements, and an ad/telephone poll. These expenditures were reported 97 days late;
 - 3) \$4,500 in-kind contribution received from Mr. Ghramm, Ms. Tveit's father, for the cost of hiring a private investigator to investigate Mr. Clay. This contribution was reported at least 265 days late; and
 - 4) \$2,600 in outstanding debts or obligations owed to Mr. Ghramm to repay the over-limit portion of his in-kind contribution.

- 11. The Campaign failed to report orders placed on a 21-day pre-general election C-4 report due October 14, 2014 totaling \$22,113, that were reported 111 days late on the combined C-4 filed February 2, 2015 that covered the period October 14, 2014 through December 10, 2014. There were invoices for Red Maverick Media through John Hanley that included \$19,386 for three direct mail pieces that was required to be reported as orders placed on the 21-day pre-general election C-4 report, due October 14, 2014. There were four expenditures to the Statesman Examiner for newspaper ads totaling \$1,552 that were required to be reported as orders placed on October 14, 2014. Finally, there was an expenditure to Silverado Express for \$1,175 for a newspaper ad that was required to be reported as an order placed on October 14, 2014.
- 12. The Campaign filed its C-3 and C-4 reports manually, on paper, rather than by the required electronic method. The campaign was required to file electronically because it raised and spent over \$5,000. The Campaign did not request an exemption from the electronic filing requirement, and therefore failed to report electronically.

IV. LAW

RCW 42.17A.205 requires candidates to file a Candidate Registration within two weeks of: filing for office or making a public announcement; after the date the campaign first has the expectation of receiving contributions or making expenditures in any election campaign, whichever is earlier.

RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 require political candidates to file timely, accurate reports of contributions and expenditures, including in-kind contributions. Under the full reporting option, until five months before the general election, C-4 reports are required monthly when contributions or expenditures exceed \$200 since the last report. C-4 reports are also required 21 and 7 days before each election, and in the month following the election, regardless of the level of activity. Contributions are reported weekly during this same time period, and must be disclosed on Monday for contributions deposited the previous seven days.

RCW 42.17A.405 states that candidates for judicial offices are subject to state contributions limits, which for the 2014 election cycle was \$1,800 per election for contributions received from an individual, corporation, union, political committee or other entity. Contributions made for the 2014 primary election were required to have been received by August 5, 2014, the date of the primary election.

RCW 42.17A.245 states, "(1) Each candidate or political committee that expended five thousand dollars or more in the preceding year or expects to expend five thousand dollars or more in the current year shall file all contribution reports and expenditure reports required by this chapter by the electronic alternative provided by the commission under RCW 42.17A.055. The commission may make exceptions on a case-by-case basis for candidates whose authorized committees lack the technological ability to file reports using the electronic alternative provided by the commission. (2) Failure by a candidate or political committee to comply with this section is a violation of this chapter."

I. Background

- 1.1 On March 18, 2010, Gina Tveit filed a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) disclosing she had recently been appointed to the position of Stevens County District Court Judge.
- 1.2 On March 18, 2010, Ms. Tveit also filed a Candidate Registration (C-1 report) registering her candidacy for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2010. Ms. Tveit initially selected the Mini Reporting Option, but on May 7, 2010, amended her registration to the Full Reporting Option.
- 1.3 Ms. Tveit was elected Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 2, 2010 general election.
- 1.4 On February 11, 2014, Michael Clay filed a C-1 report registering his candidacy for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014. Mr. Clay was a first-time candidate for public office, and selected the Full Reporting option.
- On May 8, 2014, Mr. Clay filed a complaint with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) alleging that Ms. Tveit may have violated RCW 42.17A.205, .235, and .240 by failing to timely register and report as a candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014. (Exhibit 1)
- 1.6 On May 24, 2014, Ms. Tveit filed a C-1 report registering her candidacy for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014. She selected the Full Reporting Option, which requires candidates to file frequent reports of contributions and expenditures. (Exhibit 2)
- 1.7 Ms. Tveit was elected Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 4, 2014 general election.

II. <u>Allegations & Summary of Investigative Findings</u>

- 2.1 The Complaint alleged that Ms. Tveit failed to timely register as a candidate in February 2014, after Ms. Tveit became aware that Mr. Clay was seriously considering challenging her in the November 2014 general election, and then expended funds for a private investigator to investigate Mr. Clay. Although not alleged directly by the complainant, the Compliant implied that by not registering, Ms. Tveit also failed to report the cost of hiring the private investigator.
- 2.2 PDC staff investigated the timeliness of Ms. Tveit's registration as a 2014 candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge, as well as the timeliness of reporting the initial inkind contribution received by Ms. Tveit's campaign (Campaign), which was the cost of hiring a private investigator, paid for by Ms. Tveit's father, Gary Ghramm. In addition, staff investigated whether Ms. Tveit accepted an over-limit in-kind contribution from her father for this expenditure. (RCW 42.17A.205, .235, .240 and .405.)
- 2.3 PDC staff also investigated the timeliness of other contributions and expenditures reported by the Campaign, and whether the Campaign filed its reports using the electronic method, as required. (RCW 42.17A.235, .240, and .245)
- 2.4 PDC staff opened a formal investigation on January 15, 2015. A summary of staff's findings is noted below.
- 2.5 Mr. Ghramm engaged the services of Ted Pulver, a private investigator, to investigate Mr. Clay, sometime in January 2014. Ms. Tveit acknowledged that her father would not have engaged Mr. Pulver's services, except for the fact that Mr. Clay was a potential candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge. Shortly after Mr. Ghramm engaged the services of Mr. Pulver, Mr. Clay filed his candidate registration.
- 2.6 Ms. Tveit was aware of her father's activities, and was therefore required to file a C-1, registering her candidacy, within two weeks of the date she was informed of his activities, or by no later than February 13, 2014. She filed a candidate registration 100 days late on May 24, 2014.
- 2.7 The value of Mr. Ghramm's in-kind contribution was \$4,500. Because the contribution limit to Ms. Tveit's campaign was \$1,900 per election, Ms. Tveit accepted an over-limit in-kind contribution in the amount of \$2,600.
- 2.8 The Campaign received monetary and in-kind contributions totaling \$46,679, with an equal amount of expenditures. Of this amount, Ms. Tveit contributed \$40,207 in personal funds which represented 86.5 percent of all contributions received.
- 2.9 The Campaign failed to timely file a C-3 report disclosing the receipt of \$24,791 in personal funds from Ms. Tveit on October 1, 2014. The Campaign was required to file a C-3 report disclosing receipt of this contribution by October 6, 2014, but did not report receipt of the contribution until February 2, 2015, 119 days late and nearly three months

- after the 2014 general election. The late-reported contribution represented 53.1 percent of all contributions received by the Campaign.
- 2.10 The Campaign failed to file its 7-day Pre-General election C-4 report, which was due by October 28, 2014, and its Post-General election C-4 report, which was due by December 10, 2014, until February 2, 2015. The report covered the period October 14 through December 10, 2014, and disclosed previously unreported activities undertaken by the Campaign prior to the election. The 7-day C-4 report was filed 97 days late, and the Post-General election C-4 report was filed 54 days late. The late reported activities included:
 - 1) \$24,791 monetary contribution from Ms. Tveit's personal funds;
 - 2) \$24,791 in campaign expenditures for political advertising that included direct mail pieces, newspaper advertisements, and an ad/telephone poll. These expenditures were reported 97 days late;
 - 3) \$4,500 in-kind contribution received from Mr. Ghramm, Ms. Tveit's father, for the cost of hiring a private investigator to investigate Mr. Clay. This contribution was reported at least 265 days late; and
 - 4) \$2,600 in outstanding debts or obligations owed to Mr. Ghramm to repay the over-limit portion of his in-kind contribution.
- 2.11 The Campaign filed its C-3 and C-4 reports manually, on paper, rather than by the required electronic method. The Campaign did not request an exemption from the electronic filing requirement, and therefore failed to report electronically.

III. <u>Findings</u>

- 3.1 Candidates registered under the Full Reporting option for the 2014 election were required to file weekly C-3 reports beginning June 1, 2014, and C-4 reports on the following intervals:
 - Monthly C-4 reports by the 10th of each month disclosing contribution and expenditure activities incurred in the previous calendar month, if more than \$200, provided no special reports were due during that month;
 - A 21-day pre-primary election C-4 report due on July 15, 2014, covering the period June 1 through July 14, 2014;
 - A 7-day pre-primary election C-4 report due on July 29, 2014, covering the period July 15 through July 28, 2014; and
 - A post-primary election C-4 report by September 10, 2014, covering the period July 29 through August 31, 2014.

- A 21-day pre-general election C-4 report due on October 14, 2014, covering the period September 1 through October 13, 2014;
- A 7-day pre-general election C-4 report due on October 28, 2014, covering the period October 14 through October 27, 2014; and
- A post-general election C-4 report due on December 10, 2014, covering the period October 28 through November 30, 2014.
- 3.2 Staff reviewed the C-3 and C-4 reports filed by Gina A. Tveit during the 2014 election cycle. Ms. Tveit submitted the following emailed responses and documents to PDC staff concerning Mr. Clay's allegations and staff's questions, which were also reviewed:
 - May 29, 2014, email transmitted by Ms. Tveit to PDC staff concerning her declaration of candidacy, the filing of her C-1 report, and Mr. Clay's allegations that she: (1) obtained public court records of Mr. Clay from the Court Clerk that included his three divorces and two other files, without having to pay for them and thus receiving preferential treatment; and (2) failed to timely register and report as a candidate for the 2014 election, when she received an in-kind contribution for investigative services of Mr. Clay that were paid for by Ms. Tveit's father. (Exhibit #3)
 - March 17, 2015, email transmitted by Ms. Tveit to PDC staff responding to staff's February 23, 2015, email requesting additional information from her in PDC Case No. 15-045. (Exhibit #4)
 - March 18, 2015, email transmitted by Ms. Tveit to PDC staff in which she attaches a copy of the "sample survey script" and three invoices from Red Maverick Media for the direct mail pieces. (Exhibit #5)
- 3.3 Ms. Tveit stated that she was elected Stevens County Municipal Court Judge in 2010, and that she spent approximately \$10,000 on her campaign. She stated that her 2010 campaign did not meet the required thresholds to file PDC reports electronically using the Online Reporting of Campaign Activity (ORCA). She stated that it was her intention to file her PDC reports electronically for the 2014 election, but she had no understanding of what was required to file her reports electronically for the 2014 campaign.
- 3.4 Ms. Tveit stated that when she downloaded the ORCA software, she experienced a number of problems since her personal computer ran on an outdated operating system. She stated that to date, she has been unable to transmit any of her PDC reports electronically.
- 3.5 The Campaign filed its initial C-4 report on June 11, 2014, listing no beginning date for the C-4 report, that the report disclosed activities through June 10, 2014, and included a \$5,000 monetary contribution had been received from Ms. Tveit, and one expenditure totaling \$4,862 had been made to Stick-It Signs on May 22, 2014. The C-4 report was filed one day late.

- The Campaign filed a combined June and July C-4 report on August 11, 2014, covering the reporting period of June 10 through August 10, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed that \$1,322 in monetary contributions was received by the campaign (+ \$6,000 on line 8), although no deposit information was listed, so it was not possible to ascertain when the monetary contributions had been received and deposited. The C-4 report disclosed the campaign made a number of expenditures totaling \$7,210 during the months of June and July, 2014.
- 3.7 The June 2014 portion of the activities reported on the C-4 report disclosed the Campaign made eight expenditures during the month of June totaling \$6,551. The June 2014 Campaign expenditures included; (1) Three expenditures to Stick-It Signs totaling \$4,767; (2) An \$872 expenditure to Campaign Pros for political advertisements in form of pens and notebooks; and (3) A \$543 expenditures to Colville Printing for campaign brochures. A June C-4 report was required to have been filed by the Campaign by July 10, 2014, and the June portion of campaign activities were disclosed 32 days late.
- 3.8 The Campaign filed an August on September 15, 2014, covering the reporting period August 10 through September 10, 2014, and disclosing \$3,300 in monetary contributions received, and that the campaign made six expenditures totaling \$2,607. An August C-4 report was required to have been filed by September 10, 2014. The August C-4 report was filed five days late.
- 3.9 The Campaign timely filed the 21-day Pre-General Election C-4 report on October 14, 2014, covering the reporting period of September 10 through October 13, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed the campaign received \$2,016 in new monetary contributions, and made \$2,709 in expenditures during the reporting period.

Allegation No. 1: Failure to file C-3 and C-4 reports (RCW 42.17A.235 and .240)

3.10 After timely filing the 21-day Pre-General election C-4 report on October 14, 2014, the Campaign stopped filing reports until after the November 5, 2014 general election, and after PDC staff had logged in the complaint filed by Mr. Clay. On February 2, 2015, Ms. Tveit filed a C-3 and C-4 report manually on paper as detailed below. **Exhibit #6.**

C-3 report:

- 3.11 The C-3 report disclosed Ms. Tveit contributed \$24,791 using her personal funds on October 1, 2014, and that those funds were deposited into the campaign bank account on October 1, 2014. Ms. Tveit was required to have filed a C-3 report not later than October 6, 2014 disclosing the contribution.
- 3.12 The C-3 report was filed 119 days late by Ms. Tveit and almost three months after the 2014 general election had been held. The \$24,791 monetary contribution made by Ms. Tveit in personal funds represented 53.1% of the total monetary and in-kind contributions received by the campaign for the entire 2014 election cycle.

C-4 report:

- 3.13 The Campaign failed to timely file a 7-day Pre-General election and Post-General election C-4 report.
- 3.14 On February 2, 2015, the Campaign filed one combined C-4 covering the period October 14 through December 10, 2014, and disclosing previously unreported activities that included: (1) the \$24,791 monetary contribution from Ms. Tveit; (2) \$24,791 in campaign expenditures for political advertisements; (3) a \$4,500 over-limit in-kind contribution from Ms. Tveit's father; and (4) a \$2,600 outstanding debt or obligation for the over-limit portion of the in-kind contribution.
- 3.15 The combined C-4 report disclosed a November 1, 2014, expenditure made by the Campaign to John Hanley totaling \$20,636 for the printing and postage of three direct mail pieces, and for the costs of an automated telephone poll, all reported after the November 4, 2014 general election. Staff requested and reviewed the invoices for the three direct mail pieces which listed Red Maverick Media was the vendor that printed and mailed the three direct mail pieces, for a total cost of \$19,386.
- 3.16 All three invoices from Red Maverick Media listed an orders-placed date of October 8, 2014, which required the Campaign to disclose the direct mail pieces as an outstanding obligation on the 21-day Pre-General election C-4 report. The 21-day Pre-General election C-4 report was due to be filed by the Campaign on October 14, 2014, and the \$19,386 portion of the \$20,636 expenditure made to Jon Hurley, was disclosed 111 days late.
- 3.17 The combined C-4 report also disclosed:
 - The Campaign made expenditures to the Statesman Examiner totaling \$1,552 for four newspaper advertisements in October (run dates: 10/3; 10/9; 10/16; and 10/22), and one \$1,175 expenditure to Silverado Express on October 10, 2014, for a newspaper advertisement. The five expenditures was disclosed 111 days late.
 - A \$4,500 in-kind contribution was received by the Campaign from Gary Ghramm, Ms. Tveit's father, with the description listed as "Services." The in-kind contribution was reported as having been received by the Campaign on May 12, 2014. (NOTE In section 3.22 of this Report of Investigation, Ms. Tveit acknowledged that Mr. Ghramm retained the services of a private investigator in January of 2014).
 - Based on that statement, an initial in-kind contribution should have been reported on a February 2014 C-4 report due by March 10, 2014. The in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm was disclosed 328 days late.
- 3.18 Ms. Tveit stated that she filed her C-3 and C-4 reports manually on paper, which she postmarked on February 2, 2015. Ms. Tveit stated that the failure to timely file the PDC reports was not intentional, and that the errors she encountered while attempting to file using the ORCA software contributed to the late reporting of the manual reports. She went on to state:

- That almost "...all of the money spent on my campaign came from my personal funds, other than the contributions I received which have been disclosed."
- "The monies were transferred from my personal account into my campaign account based on actual expenses incurred, which have been disclosed."
- She confirmed she deposited \$24,790.75 in personal funds into the campaign bank account on October 1, 2014, and that the amount deposited was based on campaign expenses she knew she was going to be incurring. She acknowledged that she failed to timely disclose the personal funds contributed by her on the C-3 report, and the corresponding expenditures she made using those funds on a C4 report.
- The expenditures made to Mr. Hanley by her Campaign were for three political advertisements in the form of direct mail postcards and a "telephone ID" automated poll. She stated that Stevens County is a vote-by-mail county, so she began mailing the postcards on the day the general election ballots were mailed out to registered voters by the Stevens County Auditor's Office.
- The telephone poll cost \$1,250 and was conducted with the purpose of measuring candidate name recognition, and favorable vs. unfavorable opinions of Ms. Tveit and Mr. Clay. She stated the short five questions telephone poll was conducted of "...most likely Stevens County voters with landlines."

Allegation No. 2: Receiving an in-kind contribution that exceeded the \$1,800 per election contribution limits (RCW 42.17A.405)

- 3.19 On May 8, 2014, PDC staff member Tony Perkins sent an email to Ms. Tveit informing her that PDC staff was in receipt of an inquiry alleging that her 2014 campaign for reelection had made campaign expenditures in support of her candidacy, but she had failed to file a C-1 report.
- 3.20 On May 10, 2014, Ms. Tveit responds to Mr. Perkins email stating she has not made any campaign expenditures in support of her 2014 campaign, but that once she filed her declaration of candidacy, she intended to comply with the PDC requirements and file her campaign reports.
- 3.21 On May 29, 2014, PDC staff receives Ms. Tveit's initial response to the complaint filed by Mr. Clay and responding to the allegation that she hired a private investigator to investigate him. See Exhibit #3. Ms. Tveit stated the following concerning the private investigator issue:

"Sometime in the winter or 2013, my father and I discussed the rumor that Mike Clay was considering running for District Court Judge. For years there has been widespread gossip in the community regarding Mike Clay's inappropriate relationships with women involved in the court cases he was handling, either as a deputy prosecutor or a contracted public defender, perhaps even criminal conduct..."

- 3.22 Ms. Tveit stated that her father had expressed to her his concerns regarding the Michael Clay allegations. She stated that he decided on his own to contact Ted Pulver, a private investigator in Idaho, in an attempt to confirm or deny the information about Mr. Clay that they had been hearing. She stated Mr. Pulver completed a report in April of 2014, and his "...investigation revealed very serious allegations of professional misconduct..."
- 3.23 Ms. Tveit stated she forwarded Mr. Pulver's report to the Washington State Bar Association, and went on to state that she had:
 - "....no intentions of using the information contained in the report during my campaign. I can truly say that I had never considered this a campaign expenditure, which commonly would include expenses for such items as campaign signs, advertising, brochures, etc..."
- 3.24 On June 12, 2014, Mr. Perkins sent an email to Ms. Tveit acknowledging her May 29, 2014 response email, and asking her to respond to staff's additional questions concerning the in-kind contribution from her father, Mr. Ghramm. Staff's questions included: (1) Did Ms. Tveit understand that Mr. Clay was considering running for Stevens County District Court Judge? (2) Who sponsored the investigative services of Ted Pulver, and when were those services engaged by her father? (3) Would her father have engaged Mr. Pulver's services if Mr. Clay had not been a candidate? and (4) Has her father incurred the costs for investigative services on her behalf in other instances?
- 3.25 On June 20, 2014: Ms. Tveit responded to Mr. Perkins' five questions and stated that she did assume Mr. Clay was going to be running for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014 when she was having discussions with her father, Gary Ghramm. She stated that Mr. Ghramm "...sponsored Mr. Pulver's investigation and it was his decision to do so..."
- 3.26 Ms. Tveit stated that she believed her father engaged Mr. Pulver's services sometime in January of 2014. She stated that she believed her father would not have engaged Mr. Pulver's services, but for the fact that Mr. Clay was a potential opponent in Judge Tveit's campaign for Stevens County District Court Judge. She stated that she was not aware of any other instances in which her father had engaged investigative services of that nature.
- 3.27 Ms. Tveit went on to state
 - "It is important that the information developed from the investigation has not been used by my campaign. The investigation report was immediately turned over to the Washington State Bar Association according to my obligation under the Judicial Rules of Conduct." At the end of the email, Judge Tveit stated, "If I were to publically disclose the expense at this time, what would happen next?"
- 3.28 Mr. Perkins replied to Ms. Tveit's email, and advised her to report the costs for the investigator either as an in-kind contribution from her father or as a reimbursement from the campaign to her father for the amount of the over-limit portion of the contribution. On July 31, 2014, Mr. Perkins followed-up with an additional email stating that the investigative costs had not yet been reported by the Tveit campaign. He asked Ms. Tveit whether she intended to report the costs on the PDC reports.

- 3.29 On August 4, 2014, Ms. Tveit replied that she intendeds to proceed as advised by Mr. Perkins, but she wants to talk with PDC staff in more detail concerning the complaint. On August 12, 2014, Ms. Tveit informs staff by email that she has mailed her C-3 and C-4 reports, but she still wanted to talk about the complaint.
- 3.30 On August 13, 2014, PDC received the C-4 report from the Tveit campaign, however the report failed to disclose the costs of the investigator, either as an in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm, or as a monetary expenditure from the campaign reimbursing Mr. Ghramm for the over-limit portion of the contribution.
- 3.31 On February 2, 2015, the Campaign filed a C-4 report disclosing the May 12, 2014 receipt of \$4,500 in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm, which exceeded the 2014 primary contribution limits of \$1,800 by \$2,600. The C-4 report also disclosed that the Campaign owed a \$2,600 outstanding debt or obligation to Mr. Ghramm for the overlimit portion of the contribution. This was the first-time the campaign disclosed the in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm, more than a year after Mr. Ghramm retained the investigative services of Mr. Pulver.

Allegation No. 3: Failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (RCW 42.17A.205)

- 3.32 RCW 42.17A.205 requires candidates to file a C-1 report within two weeks after the date the campaign first: (1) Solicits contributions or has the expectation of receiving contributions; (2) Reserves space, orders campaign goods or services, or makes expenditures in any election campaign; or (3) Files a Declaration of Candidacy or makes a public announcement, whichever is earlier.
- 3.33 Ms. Tveit stated that she assumed Mr. Clay was going to be running for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014, and that her father engaged Mr. Pulver's services sometime in January of 2014.
- 3.34 On February 11, 2014, Michael Clay filed a C-1 report registering his candidacy.
- 3.35 Ms. Tveit stated that she doubted her father would have engaged Mr. Pulver's services if Mr. Clay had not been a potential candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge. Based on statements she made that Mr. Ghramm first paid for Mr. Pulver's investigative services of Michael Clay on her behalf sometime in January of 2014, she was required to file a C-1 report within two weeks or not later than February 13, 2014. The C-1 report was filed 100 days late.

Gina Tveit Responses:

3.36 In 2014, Ms. Tveit stated that her opponent, Mr. Clay "...ran a very negative campaign. He let it be widely known during the campaign that he had just inherited a significant amount of money and was willing to spend whatever it took to win the election. I became worried about the effect of his constant negatively, which included negative weekly newspaper adverting and negative direct mailings..."

Gina A. Tveit Report of Investigation PDC Case No. 15-045 Page - 10 -

- 3.37 Ms. Tveit stated that for those reasons, she consulted with Mr. Hanley who contracted with Red Maverick Media to produce the three political advertisements and the telephone poll. She stated the telephone poll "...was designed to measure name recognition and to try to determine what effect my opponent's constant negative campaigning was having. I ended up deciding to send out the direct mailers starting when the general ballots were mailed out...;"
- 3.38 Ms. Tveit stated her name did not appear on the 2014 primary election ballot, and that she intended to file her PDC reports disclosing her campaign expenses, but that she was delayed due to her difficulties in filing the reports electronically. She stated that her campaign remained positive throughout, despite the fact she:
 - "...had very damaging information on my opponent from the results of the private investigator's report, I never used this information in my campaign. Even though I was well aware of my opponent's reputation within the legal community, I was shocked at the details contained in the report. Therefore, when I received a copy of the report, I immediately forwarded it the WSBA...."
- 3.39 Ms. Tveit stated that she has not received any updates concerning the status of the Washington State Bar Associations investigation into Mr. Clay.

IV. Scope

- 4.1 PDC staff reviewed the following:
 - The complaints filed against Gina Tveit by Michael Clay;
 - Campaign finance reports, including C-1, C-3 report and C-4 reports, filed by Gina Tveit for the 2014 election, and for the 2010 election;
 - Results of PDC database query;
 - Email exchanges between Ms. Tveit and PDC staff member Tony Perkins;
 - Response from Ms. Tveit.

V. <u>Law</u>

- 5.1 **RCW 42.17A.205** requires candidates to file a Candidate Registration within two weeks of: filing for office or making a public announcement; after the date the campaign first has the expectation of receiving contributions or making expenditures in any election campaign, whichever is earlier.
- 5.2 **RCW 42.17A.235 and .240** require political candidates to file timely, accurate reports of contributions and expenditures, including in-kind contributions. Under the full reporting option, until five months before the general election, C-4 reports are required monthly when contributions or expenditures exceed \$200 since the last report. C-4 reports are also required 21 and 7 days before each election, and in the month following the election, regardless of the level of activity. Contributions are reported weekly during this same

time period, and must be disclosed on Monday for contributions deposited the previous seven days.

- 5.3 RCW 42.17A.405 states that candidates for judicial offices are subject to state contributions limits, which for the 2014 election cycle was \$1,800 per election for contributions received from an individual, corporation, union, political committee or other entity. Contributions made for the 2014 primary election were required to have been received by August 5, 2014, the date of the primary election.
- 5.4 **RCW 42.17A.245** states, "(1) Each candidate or political committee that expended five thousand dollars or more in the preceding year or expects to expend five thousand dollars or more in the current year shall file all contribution reports and expenditure reports required by this chapter by the electronic alternative provided by the commission under RCW 42.17A.055. The commission may make exceptions on a case-by-case basis for candidates whose authorized committees lack the technological ability to file reports using the electronic alternative provided by the commission. (2) Failure by a candidate or political committee to comply with this section is a violation of this chapter."

My allegation is that Judge Gina Tveit hired a private investigator no later than February 10, 2014 to investigate myself once she became aware that I was seriously considering challenging her in the November 2014 general election. This was done in an attempt to dig up dirt on myself and or attempt to scare me into not running against her. As of May 8th Judge Tveit has filed nothing with the Washington State Public Disclose Commission. It is my opinion that Judge Tveit's failure to comply with Washington Election law is not deminimus but in fact is a material breach of her duty to follow the laws of this state.

In early January 2014 I was advised by a member of the Stevens County Superior Court that Judge Gina Tveit had gone to the Superior Court Clerk's Office to obtain copies of my 2 divorce files in Stevens County. I later confirmed this with the elected clerk Patricia Chester. I was also informed by Ms. Chester that there was no record of Judge Tveit paying the normal costs associated with this request. Failure to pay the costs associated with producing those records appears to be a violation of the Code of Judicial Conduct. CJC Rule 4.1 (A) (9). While a Public Disclosure Complaint is not the proper venue to investigate a violation of the Code of Judicial Conduct the information is offered as evidence of Judge Tveit's intent.

In early February I began receiving phone calls from woman I had previously dated including an ex-wife who indicated they were contacted by a private investigator. The investigator gave his name as Ted Pulver. Mr. Pulver gave vague answers when asked who he was working for. On May 6, 2014 I met with Kip Hill who is an investigative reporter with the Spokane newspaper. Mr. Hill told me he was contacted by Mr. Pulver regarding some woman I had previously dated. I was informed by the investigative reporter that Mr. Pulver indicated that he was hired by Judge Gina Tveit.

There is only one possible explanation for Judge Tveit conduct. Clearly Judge Tveit was intending to further her campaign to be reelected Stevens County District Court Judge. Hiring Mr. Pulver in an attempt to run a smear campaign against me is a clear campaign expenditure. Judge Tveit had a duty under Washington law to report the expenditure.

Please be advised that I filed a Declaration of Candidacy with the Stevens County Auditor for the position of District Court Judge on May 12, 2014. I subsequently submitted my Candidate Registration for filing with the PDC on May 21, 2014.

I will first respond to the allegation that I obtained public records from Superior Court files without paying for them. In the afternoon of Friday December 6, 2013, I went to the Superior Court Clerk's office. I stood in line at the public window. There was someone in front of me being assisted and I waited my turn. I then handed the deputy clerk, Jenna Bourgeau, a piece of paper containing 5 case numbers and said I wished to check out these files and take them home for the weekend. For the past 25 years that I have worked in the legal field, this is common practice and procedure for members of the legal community. The clerk stated that she could just "email" the files rather than pulling them and physically giving them to me. I told her that I was not familiar with that process and I wasn't even sure which documents I would want to look at from each file. She stated that she would simply email the entire file. I made it very clear that this was a personal request and not work related. If she wanted to email the files to me she would have to send them to my personal email account and not my county email account. I wrote my personal email account down on the same piece of paper that I had given to her with the case file numbers. I further told the clerk that I would not be able to retrieve the email until after I got home. AT NO TIME DID THE DEPUTY CLERK INFORM ME THAT THERE WAS A FEE DUE FOR MY REQUEST. In fact, if she had simply pulled the files as I had requested, there would be no fee incurred. AT NO TIME UP TO AND INCLUDING THE PRESENT DATE AND TIME, HAS ANYONE FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE REQUESTED THAT I PAY A FEE. After receiving this complaint, I did contact the elected Superior Court Clerk, Patricia Chester. She indicated that she did receive a phone call from Mike Clay asking whether or not I had checked out files and paid a fee. After checking with her staff, she confirmed to Clay that I had checked out files and had not paid a fee. Ms. Chester indicated to me that she did not think I had done anything improper and she would write a statement to that effect. I also stated to her that if a fee was owed I certainly would pay it. Ms. Chester told me that she would get back to me with her statement and let me know what amount, if any, was owed. As to whether or not someone from the clerk's office advised Clay that I had obtained these files, Ms. Chester was unaware of that. There wouldn't seem to be any legitimate reason for that to occur. The files that I requested were the files that are listed on the Inside Courts public website under Clay's name. The files are three of his divorce files and two criminal files. I am attaching copies of the email(s) I received from the deputy clerk with the attached files sent to my personal Hotmail account. Secondly, I will respond to the allegation regarding the private investigator. Sometime in the winter of 2013,

Secondly, I will respond to the allegation regarding the private investigator. Sometime in the winter of 2013, my father and I discussed the rumor that Mike Clay was considering running for District Court Judge. For years there has been widespread gossip in the community regarding Mike Clay's inappropriate relationships with women involved in the court cases he was handling, either as a deputy prosecutor or a contracted public

defender. My father expressed to me great concern regarding these allegations and he contacted Ted Pulver for the purpose of either confirming or denying these rumors. The fact is, Mr. Pulver's investigation revealed very serious allegations of professional misconduct, perhaps even criminal conduct. When the report was completed in April 2014, I felt that I had an obligation under the Judicial Code of Conduct to forward the report to the Bar Association, which I did do. As far as I'm concerned, the report is in the appropriate hands and that is where the matter needs to remain. I have no intentions of using the information contained in the report during my campaign. I can truly say that I had never considered this a campaign expenditure, which commonly would include expenses for such items as campaign signs, advertising, brochures, etc.

I am also attaching copies of three (3) letters received from Mike Clay indicating that as of April 2013 he had moved to Western Washington. I have never received any information indicating that he had actually returned to Stevens County and I honestly don't even know when that occurred.

In conclusion, I have always had every intention of being in compliance with the PDC requirements. I would like the opportunity to do some additional research and to talk with PDC staff with my questions. I am asking for one additional week.

I. Addendum

- 1.1 The Campaign filed a combined June and July C-4 report on August 11, 2014, covering the reporting period of June 10 through August 10, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed that \$7,322.42 was received in monetary contributions during this period. A C-3 report totaling \$7,322.42 was also received on August 11, 2014, showing \$6,000 as coming from the candidate's own funds, but not showing a date received, and \$1,322.42 coming from other contributors between July 4 and August 2, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed campaign expenditures totaling \$7,210 during the months of June and July, 2014.
- 1.2 The June 2014 portion of the expenditures totaled \$6,551. The June expenditures included: (1) Three expenditures to Stick-It Signs totaling \$4,767; (2) An \$872 expenditure to Campaign Pros for political advertisements in form of pens and notebooks; and (3) A \$543 expenditures to Colville Printing for campaign brochures. A June C-4 report was due by July 10, 2014, and the expenditures required to be disclosed on this report were filed 32 days late. (Exhibit 1 to Addendum)
- 1.3 The Campaign filed its C-3 and C-4 reports manually, on paper, rather than by the required electronic method. The Campaign did not request an exemption from the electronic filing requirement. On November 4, 2014, PDC staff sent a warning letter to Ms. Tveit stating that the required reports must be filed electronically to avoid enforcement action and a possible monetary penalty. (Exhibit 2 to Addendum)

My allegation is that Judge Gina Tveit hired a private investigator no later than February 10, 2014 to investigate myself once she became aware that I was seriously considering challenging her in the November 2014 general election. This was done in an attempt to dig up dirt on myself and or attempt to scare me into not running against her. As of May 8th Judge Tveit has filed nothing with the Washington State Public Disclose Commission. It is my opinion that Judge Tveit's failure to comply with Washington Election law is not deminimus but in fact is a material breach of her duty to follow the laws of this state.

In early January 2014 I was advised by a member of the Stevens County Superior Court that Judge Gina Tveit had gone to the Superior Court Clerk's Office to obtain copies of my 2 divorce files in Stevens County. I later confirmed this with the elected clerk Patricia Chester. I was also informed by Ms. Chester that there was no record of Judge Tveit paying the normal costs associated with this request. Failure to pay the costs associated with producing those records appears to be a violation of the Code of Judicial Conduct. CJC Rule 4.1 (A) (9). While a Public Disclosure Complaint is not the proper venue to investigate a violation of the Code of Judicial Conduct the information is offered as evidence of Judge Tveit's intent.

In early February I began receiving phone calls from woman I had previously dated including an ex-wife who indicated they were contacted by a private investigator. The investigator gave his name as Ted Pulver. Mr. Pulver gave vague answers when asked who he was working for. On May 6, 2014 I met with Kip Hill who is an investigative reporter with the Spokane newspaper. Mr. Hill told me he was contacted by Mr. Pulver regarding some woman I had previously dated. I was informed by the investigative reporter that Mr. Pulver indicated that he was hired by Judge Gina Tveit.

There is only one possible explanation for Judge Tveit conduct. Clearly Judge Tveit was intending to further her campaign to be reelected Stevens County District Court Judge. Hiring Mr. Pulver in an attempt to run a smear campaign against me is a clear campaign expenditure. Judge Tveit had a duty under Washington law to report the expenditure.

Please be advised that I filed a Declaration of Candidacy with the Stevens County Auditor for the position of District Court Judge on May 12, 2014. I subsequently submitted my Candidate Registration for filing with the PDC on May 21, 2014.

I will first respond to the allegation that I obtained public records from Superior Court files without paying for them. In the afternoon of Friday December 6, 2013, I went to the Superior Court Clerk's office. I stood in line at the public window. There was someone in front of me being assisted and I waited my turn. I then handed the deputy clerk, Jenna Bourgeau, a piece of paper containing 5 case numbers and said I wished to check out these files and take them home for the weekend. For the past 25 years that I have worked in the legal field, this is common practice and procedure for members of the legal community. The clerk stated that she could just "email" the files rather than pulling them and physically giving them to me. I told her that I was not familiar with that process and I wasn't even sure which documents I would want to look at from each file. She stated that she would simply email the entire file. I made it very clear that this was a personal request and not work related. If she wanted to email the files to me she would have to send them to my personal email account and not my county email account. I wrote my personal email account down on the same piece of paper that I had given to her with the case file numbers. I further told the clerk that I would not be able to retrieve the email until after I got home. AT NO TIME DID THE DEPUTY CLERK INFORM ME THAT THERE WAS A FEE DUE FOR MY REQUEST. In fact, if she had simply pulled the files as I had requested, there would be no fee incurred. AT NO TIME UP TO AND INCLUDING THE PRESENT DATE AND TIME, HAS ANYONE FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE REQUESTED THAT I PAY A FEE. After receiving this complaint, I did contact the elected Superior Court Clerk, Patricia Chester. She indicated that she did receive a phone call from Mike Clay asking whether or not I had checked out files and paid a fee. After checking with her staff, she confirmed to Clay that I had checked out files and had not paid a fee. Ms. Chester indicated to me that she did not think I had done anything improper and she would write a statement to that effect. I also stated to her that if a fee was owed I certainly would pay it. Ms. Chester told me that she would get back to me with her statement and let me know what amount, if any, was owed. As to whether or not someone from the clerk's office advised Clay that I had obtained these files, Ms. Chester was unaware of that. There wouldn't seem to be any legitimate reason for that to occur. The files that I requested were the files that are listed on the Inside Courts public website under Clay's name. The files are three of his divorce files and two criminal files. I am attaching copies of the email(s) I received from the deputy clerk with the attached files sent to my personal Hotmail account. Secondly, I will respond to the allegation regarding the private investigator. Sometime in the winter of 2013, my father and I discussed the rumor that Mike Clay was considering running for District Court Judge. For years there has been widespread gossip in the community regarding Mike Clay's inappropriate relationships with

women involved in the court cases he was handling, either as a deputy prosecutor or a contracted public

defender. My father expressed to me great concern regarding these allegations and he contacted Ted Pulver for the purpose of either confirming or denying these rumors. The fact is, Mr. Pulver's investigation revealed very serious allegations of professional misconduct, perhaps even criminal conduct. When the report was completed in April 2014, I felt that I had an obligation under the Judicial Code of Conduct to forward the report to the Bar Association, which I did do. As far as I'm concerned, the report is in the appropriate hands and that is where the matter needs to remain. I have no intentions of using the information contained in the report during my campaign. I can truly say that I had never considered this a campaign expenditure, which commonly would include expenses for such items as campaign signs, advertising, brochures, etc.

I am also attaching copies of three (3) letters received from Mike Clay indicating that as of April 2013 he had moved to Western Washington. I have never received any information indicating that he had actually returned to Stevens County and I honestly don't even know when that occurred.

In conclusion, I have always had every intention of being in compliance with the PDC requirements. I would like the opportunity to do some additional research and to talk with PDC staff with my questions. I am asking for one additional week.

Below are my responses to the questions that were set forth in your email dated February 23, 2015:

- 1. My intention was to file my final PDC reports electronically. When I experienced difficulty with this due to an outdated operating system on my personal pc, I filed my final reports on paper and submitted those on February 2, 2015. It was never my intention not to file the reports.
- 2. Yes, all of the money spent on my campaign came from my personal funds, other than the contributions I received which have been disclosed. The monies were transferred from my personal account into my campaign account based on actual expenses incurred, which have been disclosed.
- 3. The figure of \$24,790.75 was based on campaign expenses incurred, reported on schedule A to C4.
- 4. The advertisement expenses from Mr. Hanley were for three (3) direct mail postcards sent out starting on the day the general ballots were mailed out to the voters. Stevens County is vote by mail only. I will send you a copy of the invoices.
- 5. The phone poll was an ID autopoll. The purpose of the poll was to measure name recognition and favorable vs. unfavorable opinion as to my opponent and myself. The poll was sent to the most likely Stevens County voters with landlines. The cost of the poll was \$1250.00. I will send a copy of the script and invoice from the poll.

It might be helpful for your to understand a little bit of the background to 2014 my campaign. I was elected in 2010 to my current position and spent approximately \$10,000 on my campaign. In 2014, my opponent, Michael Clay, ran a very negative campaign. He let it be widely known during the campaign that he had just inherited a significant amount of money and was willing to spend whatever it took to win the election. I became worried about the effect of his constant negatively, which included negative weekly newspaper adverting and negative direct mailings. That is why I consulted with John Hanley of Red Maverick Media. The phone poll was designed to measure name recognition and to try to determine what effect my opponent's constant negative campaigning was having. I ended up deciding to send out the direct mailers starting when the general ballots were mailed out. My opponent and I were not on the primary ballot. I never intended to not report my campaign expenses, but I was delayed due to the difficulty I had doing so electronically. In 2010, I was not required to file my reports electronically and I had no understanding of what that would entail.

In addition, I would like you to know that my campaign remained positive throughout. Even though I had very damaging information on my opponent from the results of the private investigator's report, I never used this information in my campaign. Even though I was well aware of my opponent's reputation within the legal community, I was shocked at the details contained in the report. Therefore, when I received a coy of the report, I immediately forwarded it the WSBA. I felt I had a judicial responsibility to do so but I did not request to be involved as the complainant. As such, I do not receive updates from the bar and I do not know the status of the bar investigation. As far as I a concerned, the information is where it should be and I will let the bar association proceed however they see fit.

Please feel to contact me to discuss this matter further. Once I have provided the information you have requested, it is my intention to proceed with re-filing my reports electronically.

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) is in receipt of the Campaign Summary Contributions and Expenditures report (C-4 report) and Monetary Contributions report (C-3 report) you filed on February 2, 2015. PDC staff reviewed the C-3 and C-4 reports you submitted manually on paper, and found you filed a C-4 report on October 14, 2014 on paper covering the period September 10 through October 13, 2014, and then it appears you stopped filing until after staff logged in the complaint filed by Mr. Clay.

The C-4 report you submitted on February 2, 2015, stated that it covered the period October 14 through December 10, 2014, but disclosed information dating back to October 1, 2014, so the dates covered by the 21-day pre-general election C-4 report and the 7-day pre-general election C-4 report overlapped one another.

Staff is following-up on the information you disclosed on those C-3 and C-4 reports, the allegations listed in the complaint, and your prior correspondence with PDC staff concerning the following three issues: (1) Late-filed campaign finance reports and the information disclosed on those reports; (2) Receipt of over-limit in-kind contributions from Gary Ghramm; and (3) Details concerning the telephone poll or survey calls undertaken on behalf of your campaign. Concerning the February 2, 2015 reports:

- Please explain why you stopped filing PDC reports on paper prior to the election.
- Did you make a \$24,790.75 monetary contribution using personal funds to your campaign on October 1, 2014, and deposit those funds into the campaign bank account? Did you write any personal checks for expenditures that were reported on the Schedule A to C-4 report?
- The C-3 report and Schedule A to C-4 report disclosed you deposited \$24,790.75 into the campaign bank account on October 1, 2014, why did you decide to contribute that amount to your campaign? Was it based on any campaign budget projections or part of the campaign plan?

- Please describe the nature of the advertisements undertaken through Mr. Hunley (i.e. direct mail, newspaper; radio or television ads; etc...), and the original vendor(s) names, addresses, and amounts paid by Mr. Hunley for the political advertisements.
- Please describe the "phone poll" such as when it was conducted, by whom, how much it cost. What was the sample size and methodology?
- Please provide copies of the invoices for the political advertisements and "phone poll" undertaken by Mr. Hunley on behalf of the campaign, and also provide a copy of the telephone poll or the script for the calls.

Concerning the \$4,500 in-kind contribution from Gary Ghramm, and disclosure of the costs he incurred to investigate Michael Clay, you reported the description of the work performed for the in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm generically as "Services." Below are my responses to the questions that were set forth in your email dated February 23, 2015:

- 1. My intention was to file my final PDC reports electronically. When I experienced difficulty with this due to an outdated operating system on my personal pc, I filed my final reports on paper and submitted those on February 2, 2015. It was never my intention not to file the reports.
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- 4. The advertisement expenses from Mr. Hanley were for three (3) direct mail postcards sent out starting on the day the general ballots were mailed out to the voters. Stevens County is vote by mail only. I will send you a copy of the invoices.
- 5. The phone poll was an ID autopoll. The purpose of the poll was to measure name recognition and favorable vs. unfavorable opinion as to my opponent and myself. The poll was sent to the most likely Stevens County voters with landlines. The cost of the poll was \$1250.00. I will send a copy of the script and invoice from the poll.

It might be helpful for your to understand a little bit of the background to 2014 my campaign. I was elected in 2010 to my current position and spent approximately \$10,000 on my campaign. In 2014, my opponent, Michael Clay, ran a very negative campaign. He let it be widely known during the campaign that he had just inherited a significant amount of money and was willing to spend whatever it took to win the election. I became worried about the effect of his constant negatively, which included negative weekly newspaper adverting and negative direct mailings. That is why I consulted with John Hanley of Red Maverick Media. The phone poll was designed to measure name recognition and to try to determine what effect my opponent's constant negative campaigning was having. I ended up deciding to send out the direct mailers starting when the general ballots were mailed out. My opponent and I were not on the primary ballot. I never intended to not report my campaign expenses, but I was delayed due to the difficulty I had doing so electronically. In 2010, I was not required to file my reports electronically and I had no understanding of what that would entail.

In addition, I would like you to know that my campaign remained positive throughout. Even though I had very damaging information on my opponent from the results of the private investigator's report, I never used this information in my campaign. Even though I was well aware of my opponent's reputation within the legal community, I was shocked at the details contained in the report. Therefore, when I received a coy of the report, I immediately forwarded it the WSBA. I felt I had a judicial responsibility to do so but I did not request to be involved as the complainant. As such, I do not receive updates from the bar and I do not know the status of the bar investigation. As far as I a concerned, the information is where it should be and I will let the bar association proceed however they see fit.

Please feel to contact me to discuss this matter further. Once I have provided the information you have requested, it is my intention to proceed with re-filing my reports electronically.

Dear Mr. Stutzman.

Please be advised that I filed a Declaration of Candidacy with the Stevens County Auditor for the position of District Court Judge on May 12, 2014. I subsequently submitted my Candidate Registration for filing with the PDC on May 21, 2014.

I will first respond to the allegation that I obtained public records from Superior Court files without paying for them. In the afternoon of Friday December 6, 2013, I went to the Superior Court Clerk's office. I stood in line at the public window. There was someone in front of me being assisted and I waited my turn. I then handed the deputy clerk, Jenna Bourgeau, a piece of paper containing 5 case numbers and said I wished to check out these files and take them home for the weekend. For the past 25 years that I have worked in the legal field, this is common practice and procedure for members of the legal community. The clerk stated that she could just "email" the files rather than pulling them and physically giving them to me. I told her that I was not familiar with that process and I wasn't even sure Exhibit S-9

which documents I would want to look at from each file. She stated that she would simply email the entire file. I made it very clear that this was a personal request and not work related. If she wanted to email the files to me she would have to send them to my personal email account and not my county email account. I wrote my personal email account down on the same piece of paper that I had given to her with the case file numbers. I further told the clerk that I would not be able to retrieve the email until after I got home. AT NO TIME DID THE DEPUTY CLERK INFORM ME THAT THERE WAS A FEE DUE FOR MY REQUEST. In fact, if she had simply pulled the files as I had requested, there would be no fee incurred. AT NO TIME UP TO AND INCLUDING THE PRESENT DATE AND TIME, HAS ANYONE FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE REQUESTED THAT I PAY A FEE. After receiving this complaint, I did contact the elected Superior Court Clerk, Patricia Chester. She indicated that she did receive a phone call from Mike Clay asking whether or not I had checked out files and paid a fee. After checking with her staff, she confirmed to Clay that I had checked out files and had not paid a fee. Ms. Chester indicated to me that she did not think I had done anything improper and she would write a statement to that effect. I also stated to her that if a fee was owed I certainly would pay it. Ms. Chester told me that she would get back to me with her statement and let me know what amount, if any, was owed. As to whether or not someone from the clerk's office advised Clay that I had obtained these files, Ms. Chester was unaware of that. There wouldn't seem to be any legitimate reason for that to occur. The files that I requested were the files that are listed on the *Inside Courts* public website under Clay's name. The files are three of his divorce files and two criminal files. I am attaching copies of the email(s) I received from the deputy clerk with the attached files sent to my personal Hotmail account. Secondly, I will respond to the allegation regarding the private investigator. Sometime in the winter of 2013, my father and I discussed the rumor that Mike Clay was considering running for District Court Judge. For years there has been widespread gossip in the community regarding Mike Clay's inappropriate relationships with women involved in the court cases he was handling, either as a deputy prosecutor or a contracted public defender. My father expressed to me great concern regarding these allegations and he contacted Ted Pulver for the purpose of either confirming or denying these rumors. The fact is, Mr. Pulver's investigation revealed very serious allegations of professional misconduct, perhaps even criminal conduct. When the report was completed in April 2014, I felt that I had an obligation under the Judicial Code of Conduct to forward the report to the Bar Association, which I did do. As far as I'm concerned, the report is in the appropriate hands and that is where the matter needs to remain. I have no intentions of using the information contained in the report during my campaign. I can truly say that I had never considered this a campaign expenditure, which commonly would include

I am also attaching copies of three (3) letters received from Mike Clay indicating that as of April 2013 he had moved to Western Washington. I have never received any information indicating that he had actually returned to Stevens County and I honestly don't even know when that occurred.

expenses for such items as campaign signs, advertising, brochures, etc.

In conclusion, I have always had every intention of being in compliance with the PDC requirements. I would like the opportunity to do some additional research and to talk with PDC staff with my questions. I am asking for one additional week.

I. Background

- 1.1 On March 18, 2010, Gina Tveit filed a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) disclosing she had recently been appointed to the position of Stevens County District Court Judge.
- 1.2 On March 18, 2010, Ms. Tveit also filed a Candidate Registration (C-1 report) registering her candidacy for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2010. Ms. Tveit initially selected the Mini Reporting Option, but on May 7, 2010, amended her registration to the Full Reporting Option.
- 1.3 Ms. Tveit was elected Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 2, 2010 general election.
- 1.4 On February 11, 2014, Michael Clay filed a C-1 report registering his candidacy for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014. Mr. Clay was a first-time candidate for public office, and selected the Full Reporting option.
- On May 8, 2014, Mr. Clay filed a complaint with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) alleging that Ms. Tveit may have violated RCW 42.17A.205, .235, and .240 by failing to timely register and report as a candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014. (Exhibit 1)
- 1.6 On May 24, 2014, Ms. Tveit filed a C-1 report registering her candidacy for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014. She selected the Full Reporting Option, which requires candidates to file frequent reports of contributions and expenditures. (Exhibit 2)
- 1.7 Ms. Tveit was elected Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 4, 2014 general election.

II. Allegations & Summary of Investigative Findings

- 2.1 The Complaint alleged that Ms. Tveit failed to timely register as a candidate in February 2014, after Ms. Tveit became aware that Mr. Clay was seriously considering challenging her in the November 2014 general election, and then expended funds for a private investigator to investigate Mr. Clay. Although not alleged directly by the complainant, the Compliant implied that by not registering, Ms. Tveit also failed to report the cost of hiring the private investigator.
- 2.2 PDC staff investigated the timeliness of Ms. Tveit's registration as a 2014 candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge, as well as the timeliness of reporting the initial inkind contribution received by Ms. Tveit's campaign (Campaign), which was the cost of hiring a private investigator, paid for by Ms. Tveit's father, Gary Ghramm. In addition, staff investigated whether Ms. Tveit accepted an over-limit in-kind contribution from her father for this expenditure. (RCW 42.17A.205, .235, .240 and .405.)
- 2.3 PDC staff also investigated the timeliness of other contributions and expenditures reported by the Campaign, and whether the Campaign filed its reports using the electronic method, as required. (RCW 42.17A.235, .240, and .245)
- 2.4 PDC staff opened a formal investigation on January 15, 2015. A summary of staff's findings is noted below.
- 2.5 Mr. Ghramm engaged the services of Ted Pulver, a private investigator, to investigate Mr. Clay, sometime in January 2014. Ms. Tveit acknowledged that her father would not have engaged Mr. Pulver's services, except for the fact that Mr. Clay was a potential candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge. Shortly after Mr. Ghramm engaged the services of Mr. Pulver, Mr. Clay filed his candidate registration.
- 2.6 Ms. Tveit was aware of her father's activities, and was therefore required to file a C-1, registering her candidacy, within two weeks of the date she was informed of his activities, or by no later than February 13, 2014. She filed a candidate registration 100 days late on May 24, 2014.
- 2.7 The value of Mr. Ghramm's in-kind contribution was \$4,500. Because the contribution limit to Ms. Tveit's campaign was \$1,900 per election, Ms. Tveit accepted an over-limit in-kind contribution in the amount of \$2,600.
- 2.8 The Campaign received monetary and in-kind contributions totaling \$46,679, with an equal amount of expenditures. Of this amount, Ms. Tveit contributed \$40,207 in personal funds which represented 86.5 percent of all contributions received.
- 2.9 The Campaign failed to timely file a C-3 report disclosing the receipt of \$24,791 in personal funds from Ms. Tveit on October 1, 2014. The Campaign was required to file a C-3 report disclosing receipt of this contribution by October 6, 2014, but did not report receipt of the contribution until February 2, 2015, 119 days late and nearly three months

- after the 2014 general election. The late-reported contribution represented 53.1 percent of all contributions received by the Campaign.
- 2.10 The Campaign failed to file its 7-day Pre-General election C-4 report, which was due by October 28, 2014, and its Post-General election C-4 report, which was due by December 10, 2014, until February 2, 2015. The report covered the period October 14 through December 10, 2014, and disclosed previously unreported activities undertaken by the Campaign prior to the election. The 7-day C-4 report was filed 97 days late, and the Post-General election C-4 report was filed 54 days late. The late reported activities included:
 - 1) \$24,791 monetary contribution from Ms. Tveit's personal funds;
 - 2) \$24,791 in campaign expenditures for political advertising that included direct mail pieces, newspaper advertisements, and an ad/telephone poll. These expenditures were reported 97 days late;
 - 3) \$4,500 in-kind contribution received from Mr. Ghramm, Ms. Tveit's father, for the cost of hiring a private investigator to investigate Mr. Clay. This contribution was reported at least 265 days late; and
 - 4) \$2,600 in outstanding debts or obligations owed to Mr. Ghramm to repay the over-limit portion of his in-kind contribution.
- 2.11 The Campaign filed its C-3 and C-4 reports manually, on paper, rather than by the required electronic method. The Campaign did not request an exemption from the electronic filing requirement, and therefore failed to report electronically.

III. <u>Findings</u>

- 3.1 Candidates registered under the Full Reporting option for the 2014 election were required to file weekly C-3 reports beginning June 1, 2014, and C-4 reports on the following intervals:
 - Monthly C-4 reports by the 10th of each month disclosing contribution and expenditure activities incurred in the previous calendar month, if more than \$200, provided no special reports were due during that month;
 - A 21-day pre-primary election C-4 report due on July 15, 2014, covering the period June 1 through July 14, 2014;
 - A 7-day pre-primary election C-4 report due on July 29, 2014, covering the period July 15 through July 28, 2014; and
 - A post-primary election C-4 report by September 10, 2014, covering the period July 29 through August 31, 2014.

Gina A. Tveit Report of Investigation PDC Case No. 15-045 Page - 4 -

- A 21-day pre-general election C-4 report due on October 14, 2014, covering the period September 1 through October 13, 2014;
- A 7-day pre-general election C-4 report due on October 28, 2014, covering the period October 14 through October 27, 2014; and
- A post-general election C-4 report due on December 10, 2014, covering the period October 28 through November 30, 2014.
- 3.2 Staff reviewed the C-3 and C-4 reports filed by Gina A. Tveit during the 2014 election cycle. Ms. Tveit submitted the following emailed responses and documents to PDC staff concerning Mr. Clay's allegations and staff's questions, which were also reviewed:
 - May 29, 2014, email transmitted by Ms. Tveit to PDC staff concerning her declaration of candidacy, the filing of her C-1 report, and Mr. Clay's allegations that she: (1) obtained public court records of Mr. Clay from the Court Clerk that included his three divorces and two other files, without having to pay for them and thus receiving preferential treatment; and (2) failed to timely register and report as a candidate for the 2014 election, when she received an in-kind contribution for investigative services of Mr. Clay that were paid for by Ms. Tveit's father. (Exhibit #3)
 - March 17, 2015, email transmitted by Ms. Tveit to PDC staff responding to staff's February 23, 2015, email requesting additional information from her in PDC Case No. 15-045. (Exhibit #4)
 - March 18, 2015, email transmitted by Ms. Tveit to PDC staff in which she attaches a copy of the "sample survey script" and three invoices from Red Maverick Media for the direct mail pieces. (Exhibit #5)
- 3.3 Ms. Tveit stated that she was elected Stevens County Municipal Court Judge in 2010, and that she spent approximately \$10,000 on her campaign. She stated that her 2010 campaign did not meet the required thresholds to file PDC reports electronically using the Online Reporting of Campaign Activity (ORCA). She stated that it was her intention to file her PDC reports electronically for the 2014 election, but she had no understanding of what was required to file her reports electronically for the 2014 campaign.
- 3.4 Ms. Tveit stated that when she downloaded the ORCA software, she experienced a number of problems since her personal computer ran on an outdated operating system. She stated that to date, she has been unable to transmit any of her PDC reports electronically.
- 3.5 The Campaign filed its initial C-4 report on June 11, 2014, listing no beginning date for the C-4 report, that the report disclosed activities through June 10, 2014, and included a \$5,000 monetary contribution had been received from Ms. Tveit, and one expenditure totaling \$4,862 had been made to Stick-It Signs on May 22, 2014. The C-4 report was filed one day late.

- 3.6 The Campaign filed a combined June and July C-4 report on August 11, 2014, covering the reporting period of June 10 through August 10, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed that \$1,322 in monetary contributions was received by the campaign (+ \$6,000 on line 8), although no deposit information was listed, so it was not possible to ascertain when the monetary contributions had been received and deposited. The C-4 report disclosed the campaign made a number of expenditures totaling \$7,210 during the months of June and July, 2014.
- 3.7 The June 2014 portion of the activities reported on the C-4 report disclosed the Campaign made eight expenditures during the month of June totaling \$6,551. The June 2014 Campaign expenditures included; (1) Three expenditures to Stick-It Signs totaling \$4,767; (2) An \$872 expenditure to Campaign Pros for political advertisements in form of pens and notebooks; and (3) A \$543 expenditures to Colville Printing for campaign brochures. A June C-4 report was required to have been filed by the Campaign by July 10, 2014, and the June portion of campaign activities were disclosed 32 days late.
- 3.8 The Campaign filed an August on September 15, 2014, covering the reporting period August 10 through September 10, 2014, and disclosing \$3,300 in monetary contributions received, and that the campaign made six expenditures totaling \$2,607. An August C-4 report was required to have been filed by September 10, 2014. The August C-4 report was filed five days late.
- 3.9 The Campaign timely filed the 21-day Pre-General Election C-4 report on October 14, 2014, covering the reporting period of September 10 through October 13, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed the campaign received \$2,016 in new monetary contributions, and made \$2,709 in expenditures during the reporting period.

Allegation No. 1: Failure to file C-3 and C-4 reports (RCW 42.17A.235 and .240)

3.10 After timely filing the 21-day Pre-General election C-4 report on October 14, 2014, the Campaign stopped filing reports until after the November 5, 2014 general election, and after PDC staff had logged in the complaint filed by Mr. Clay. On February 2, 2015, Ms. Tveit filed a C-3 and C-4 report manually on paper as detailed below. **Exhibit** #6.

C-3 report:

- 3.11 The C-3 report disclosed Ms. Tveit contributed \$24,791 using her personal funds on October 1, 2014, and that those funds were deposited into the campaign bank account on October 1, 2014. Ms. Tveit was required to have filed a C-3 report not later than October 6, 2014 disclosing the contribution.
- 3.12 The C-3 report was filed 119 days late by Ms. Tveit and almost three months after the 2014 general election had been held. The \$24,791 monetary contribution made by Ms. Tveit in personal funds represented 53.1% of the total monetary and in-kind contributions received by the campaign for the entire 2014 election cycle.

Gina A. Tveit Report of Investigation PDC Case No. 15-045 Page - 6 -

C-4 report:

- 3.13 The Campaign failed to timely file a 7-day Pre-General election and Post-General election C-4 report.
- 3.14 On February 2, 2015, the Campaign filed one combined C-4 covering the period October 14 through December 10, 2014, and disclosing previously unreported activities that included: (1) the \$24,791 monetary contribution from Ms. Tveit; (2) \$24,791 in campaign expenditures for political advertisements; (3) a \$4,500 over-limit in-kind contribution from Ms. Tveit's father; and (4) a \$2,600 outstanding debt or obligation for the over-limit portion of the in-kind contribution.
- 3.15 The combined C-4 report disclosed a November 1, 2014, expenditure made by the Campaign to John Hanley totaling \$20,636 for the printing and postage of three direct mail pieces, and for the costs of an automated telephone poll, all reported after the November 4, 2014 general election. Staff requested and reviewed the invoices for the three direct mail pieces which listed Red Maverick Media was the vendor that printed and mailed the three direct mail pieces, for a total cost of \$19,386.
- 3.16 All three invoices from Red Maverick Media listed an orders-placed date of October 8, 2014, which required the Campaign to disclose the direct mail pieces as an outstanding obligation on the 21-day Pre-General election C-4 report. The 21-day Pre-General election C-4 report was due to be filed by the Campaign on October 14, 2014, and the \$19,386 portion of the \$20,636 expenditure made to Jon Hurley, was disclosed 111 days late.
- 3.17 The combined C-4 report also disclosed:
 - The Campaign made expenditures to the Statesman Examiner totaling \$1,552 for four newspaper advertisements in October (run dates: 10/3; 10/9; 10/16; and 10/22), and one \$1,175 expenditure to Silverado Express on October 10, 2014, for a newspaper advertisement. The five expenditures was disclosed 111 days late.
 - A \$4,500 in-kind contribution was received by the Campaign from Gary Ghramm, Ms. Tveit's father, with the description listed as "Services." The in-kind contribution was reported as having been received by the Campaign on May 12, 2014. (NOTE In section 3.22 of this Report of Investigation, Ms. Tveit acknowledged that Mr. Ghramm retained the services of a private investigator in January of 2014).
 - Based on that statement, an initial in-kind contribution should have been reported on a February 2014 C-4 report due by March 10, 2014. The in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm was disclosed 328 days late.
- 3.18 Ms. Tveit stated that she filed her C-3 and C-4 reports manually on paper, which she postmarked on February 2, 2015. Ms. Tveit stated that the failure to timely file the PDC reports was not intentional, and that the errors she encountered while attempting to file using the ORCA software contributed to the late reporting of the manual reports. She went on to state:

Gina A. Tveit Report of Investigation PDC Case No. 15-045 Page - 7 -

- That almost "...all of the money spent on my campaign came from my personal funds, other than the contributions I received which have been disclosed."
- "The monies were transferred from my personal account into my campaign account based on actual expenses incurred, which have been disclosed."
- She confirmed she deposited \$24,790.75 in personal funds into the campaign bank account on October 1, 2014, and that the amount deposited was based on campaign expenses she knew she was going to be incurring. She acknowledged that she failed to timely disclose the personal funds contributed by her on the C-3 report, and the corresponding expenditures she made using those funds on a C4 report.
- The expenditures made to Mr. Hanley by her Campaign were for three political advertisements in the form of direct mail postcards and a "telephone ID" automated poll. She stated that Stevens County is a vote-by-mail county, so she began mailing the postcards on the day the general election ballots were mailed out to registered voters by the Stevens County Auditor's Office.
- The telephone poll cost \$1,250 and was conducted with the purpose of measuring candidate name recognition, and favorable vs. unfavorable opinions of Ms. Tveit and Mr. Clay. She stated the short five questions telephone poll was conducted of "...most likely Stevens County voters with landlines."

Allegation No. 2: Receiving an in-kind contribution that exceeded the \$1,800 per election contribution limits (RCW 42.17A.405)

- 3.19 On May 8, 2014, PDC staff member Tony Perkins sent an email to Ms. Tveit informing her that PDC staff was in receipt of an inquiry alleging that her 2014 campaign for reelection had made campaign expenditures in support of her candidacy, but she had failed to file a C-1 report.
- 3.20 On May 10, 2014, Ms. Tveit responds to Mr. Perkins email stating she has not made any campaign expenditures in support of her 2014 campaign, but that once she filed her declaration of candidacy, she intended to comply with the PDC requirements and file her campaign reports.
- 3.21 On May 29, 2014, PDC staff receives Ms. Tveit's initial response to the complaint filed by Mr. Clay and responding to the allegation that she hired a private investigator to investigate him. See Exhibit #3. Ms. Tveit stated the following concerning the private investigator issue:
 - "Sometime in the winter or 2013, my father and I discussed the rumor that Mike Clay was considering running for District Court Judge. For years there has been widespread gossip in the community regarding Mike Clay's inappropriate relationships with women involved in the court cases he was handling, either as a deputy prosecutor or a contracted public defender, perhaps even criminal conduct..."

Gina A. Tveit Report of Investigation PDC Case No. 15-045 Page - 8 -

- 3.22 Ms. Tveit stated that her father had expressed to her his concerns regarding the Michael Clay allegations. She stated that he decided on his own to contact Ted Pulver, a private investigator in Idaho, in an attempt to confirm or deny the information about Mr. Clay that they had been hearing. She stated Mr. Pulver completed a report in April of 2014, and his "...investigation revealed very serious allegations of professional misconduct..."
- 3.23 Ms. Tveit stated she forwarded Mr. Pulver's report to the Washington State Bar Association, and went on to state that she had:
 - "....no intentions of using the information contained in the report during my campaign. I can truly say that I had never considered this a campaign expenditure, which commonly would include expenses for such items as campaign signs, advertising, brochures, etc..."
- 3.24 On June 12, 2014, Mr. Perkins sent an email to Ms. Tveit acknowledging her May 29, 2014 response email, and asking her to respond to staff's additional questions concerning the in-kind contribution from her father, Mr. Ghramm. Staff's questions included: (1) Did Ms. Tveit understand that Mr. Clay was considering running for Stevens County District Court Judge? (2) Who sponsored the investigative services of Ted Pulver, and when were those services engaged by her father? (3) Would her father have engaged Mr. Pulver's services if Mr. Clay had not been a candidate? and (4) Has her father incurred the costs for investigative services on her behalf in other instances?
- 3.25 On June 20, 2014: Ms. Tveit responded to Mr. Perkins' five questions and stated that she did assume Mr. Clay was going to be running for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014 when she was having discussions with her father, Gary Ghramm. She stated that Mr. Ghramm "...sponsored Mr. Pulver's investigation and it was his decision to do so..."
- 3.26 Ms. Tveit stated that she believed her father engaged Mr. Pulver's services sometime in January of 2014. She stated that she believed her father would not have engaged Mr. Pulver's services, but for the fact that Mr. Clay was a potential opponent in Judge Tveit's campaign for Stevens County District Court Judge. She stated that she was not aware of any other instances in which her father had engaged investigative services of that nature.
- 3.27 Ms. Tveit went on to state
 - "It is important that the information developed from the investigation has not been used by my campaign. The investigation report was immediately turned over to the Washington State Bar Association according to my obligation under the Judicial Rules of Conduct." At the end of the email, Judge Tveit stated, "If I were to publically disclose the expense at this time, what would happen next?"
- 3.28 Mr. Perkins replied to Ms. Tveit's email, and advised her to report the costs for the investigator either as an in-kind contribution from her father or as a reimbursement from the campaign to her father for the amount of the over-limit portion of the contribution. On July 31, 2014, Mr. Perkins followed-up with an additional email stating that the investigative costs had not yet been reported by the Tveit campaign. He asked Ms. Tveit whether she intended to report the costs on the PDC reports.

Gina A. Tveit Report of Investigation PDC Case No. 15-045 Page - 9 -

- 3.29 On August 4, 2014, Ms. Tveit replied that she intendeds to proceed as advised by Mr. Perkins, but she wants to talk with PDC staff in more detail concerning the complaint. On August 12, 2014, Ms. Tveit informs staff by email that she has mailed her C-3 and C-4 reports, but she still wanted to talk about the complaint.
- 3.30 On August 13, 2014, PDC received the C-4 report from the Tveit campaign, however the report failed to disclose the costs of the investigator, either as an in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm, or as a monetary expenditure from the campaign reimbursing Mr. Ghramm for the over-limit portion of the contribution.
- 3.31 On February 2, 2015, the Campaign filed a C-4 report disclosing the May 12, 2014 receipt of \$4,500 in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm, which exceeded the 2014 primary contribution limits of \$1,800 by \$2,600. The C-4 report also disclosed that the Campaign owed a \$2,600 outstanding debt or obligation to Mr. Ghramm for the overlimit portion of the contribution. This was the first-time the campaign disclosed the in-kind contribution from Mr. Ghramm, more than a year after Mr. Ghramm retained the investigative services of Mr. Pulver.

Allegation No. 3: Failure to timely file a Candidate Registration (RCW 42.17A.205)

- 3.32 RCW 42.17A.205 requires candidates to file a C-1 report within two weeks after the date the campaign first: (1) Solicits contributions or has the expectation of receiving contributions; (2) Reserves space, orders campaign goods or services, or makes expenditures in any election campaign; or (3) Files a Declaration of Candidacy or makes a public announcement, whichever is earlier.
- 3.33 Ms. Tveit stated that she assumed Mr. Clay was going to be running for Stevens County District Court Judge in 2014, and that her father engaged Mr. Pulver's services sometime in January of 2014.
- 3.34 On February 11, 2014, Michael Clay filed a C-1 report registering his candidacy.
- 3.35 Ms. Tveit stated that she doubted her father would have engaged Mr. Pulver's services if Mr. Clay had not been a potential candidate for Stevens County District Court Judge. Based on statements she made that Mr. Ghramm first paid for Mr. Pulver's investigative services of Michael Clay on her behalf sometime in January of 2014, she was required to file a C-1 report within two weeks or not later than February 13, 2014. The C-1 report was filed 100 days late.

Gina Tveit Responses:

3.36 In 2014, Ms. Tveit stated that her opponent, Mr. Clay "...ran a very negative campaign. He let it be widely known during the campaign that he had just inherited a significant amount of money and was willing to spend whatever it took to win the election. I became worried about the effect of his constant negatively, which included negative weekly newspaper adverting and negative direct mailings..."

Gina A. Tveit Report of Investigation PDC Case No. 15-045 Page - 10 -

- 3.37 Ms. Tveit stated that for those reasons, she consulted with Mr. Hanley who contracted with Red Maverick Media to produce the three political advertisements and the telephone poll. She stated the telephone poll "...was designed to measure name recognition and to try to determine what effect my opponent's constant negative campaigning was having. I ended up deciding to send out the direct mailers starting when the general ballots were mailed out...;"
- 3.38 Ms. Tveit stated her name did not appear on the 2014 primary election ballot, and that she intended to file her PDC reports disclosing her campaign expenses, but that she was delayed due to her difficulties in filing the reports electronically. She stated that her campaign remained positive throughout, despite the fact she:
 - "...had very damaging information on my opponent from the results of the private investigator's report, I never used this information in my campaign. Even though I was well aware of my opponent's reputation within the legal community, I was shocked at the details contained in the report. Therefore, when I received a copy of the report, I immediately forwarded it the WSBA...."
- 3.39 Ms. Tveit stated that she has not received any updates concerning the status of the Washington State Bar Associations investigation into Mr. Clay.

IV. Scope

- 4.1 PDC staff reviewed the following:
 - The complaints filed against Gina Tveit by Michael Clay;
 - Campaign finance reports, including C-1, C-3 report and C-4 reports, filed by Gina Tveit for the 2014 election, and for the 2010 election;
 - Results of PDC database query;
 - Email exchanges between Ms. Tveit and PDC staff member Tony Perkins;
 - Response from Ms. Tveit.

V. Law

- 5.1 **RCW 42.17A.205** requires candidates to file a Candidate Registration within two weeks of: filing for office or making a public announcement; after the date the campaign first has the expectation of receiving contributions or making expenditures in any election campaign, whichever is earlier.
- 5.2 **RCW 42.17A.235 and .240** require political candidates to file timely, accurate reports of contributions and expenditures, including in-kind contributions. Under the full reporting option, until five months before the general election, C-4 reports are required monthly when contributions or expenditures exceed \$200 since the last report. C-4 reports are also required 21 and 7 days before each election, and in the month following the election, regardless of the level of activity. Contributions are reported weekly during this same

time period, and must be disclosed on Monday for contributions deposited the previous seven days.

- 5.3 RCW 42.17A.405 states that candidates for judicial offices are subject to state contributions limits, which for the 2014 election cycle was \$1,800 per election for contributions received from an individual, corporation, union, political committee or other entity. Contributions made for the 2014 primary election were required to have been received by August 5, 2014, the date of the primary election.
- 5.4 RCW 42.17A.245 states, "(1) Each candidate or political committee that expended five thousand dollars or more in the preceding year or expects to expend five thousand dollars or more in the current year shall file all contribution reports and expenditure reports required by this chapter by the electronic alternative provided by the commission under RCW 42.17A.055. The commission may make exceptions on a case-by-case basis for candidates whose authorized committees lack the technological ability to file reports using the electronic alternative provided by the commission. (2) Failure by a candidate or political committee to comply with this section is a violation of this chapter."

I. Addendum

- 1.1 The Campaign filed a combined June and July C-4 report on August 11, 2014, covering the reporting period of June 10 through August 10, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed that \$7,322.42 was received in monetary contributions during this period. A C-3 report totaling \$7,322.42 was also received on August 11, 2014, showing \$6,000 as coming from the candidate's own funds, but not showing a date received, and \$1,322.42 coming from other contributors between July 4 and August 2, 2014. The C-4 report disclosed campaign expenditures totaling \$7,210 during the months of June and July, 2014.
- 1.2 The June 2014 portion of the expenditures totaled \$6,551. The June expenditures included: (1) Three expenditures to Stick-It Signs totaling \$4,767; (2) An \$872 expenditure to Campaign Pros for political advertisements in form of pens and notebooks; and (3) A \$543 expenditures to Colville Printing for campaign brochures. A June C-4 report was due by July 10, 2014, and the expenditures required to be disclosed on this report were filed 32 days late. (Exhibit 1 to Addendum)
- 1.3 The Campaign filed its C-3 and C-4 reports manually, on paper, rather than by the required electronic method. The Campaign did not request an exemption from the electronic filing requirement. On November 4, 2014, PDC staff sent a warning letter to Ms. Tveit stating that the required reports must be filed electronically to avoid enforcement action and a possible monetary penalty. (Exhibit 2 to Addendum)

The parties to this Stipulation, namely, the Public Disclosure Commission Staff, through its Executive Director, Evelyn Lopez, and Respondent Gina Tveit, through her attorney, Jerry J. Moberg, submit this Stipulation as to Facts in this matter. The parties agree that the Commission has the authority to accept, reject or modify the terms of this Stipulation. The parties further agree that in the event that the Commission suggests modification to any term of this agreement, each party reserves the right to reject that modification. In the event either party rejects a modification, this matter will proceed to hearing before the Commission.

JURISDICTION

The Public Disclosure Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to RCW 42.17A, the state campaign finance and disclosure laws; RCW 34.05, the Administrative Procedure Act; and WAC 390.

FACTS

- Gina Tveit was elected Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 2, 2010
 general election. On May 24, 2014, Ms. Tveit filed a C-1 report registering her candidacy for
 re-election in 2014. There was no primary election held for the office. Ms. Tveit was elected
 Stevens County District Court Judge in the November 4, 2014 general election.
- 2. In the winter of 2013, Ms. Tveit and her father, Gary Ghramm, discussed a rumor that Michael Clay was considering running for Stevens County District Court Judge. Ms. Tveit's

STIPULATION AS TO FACTS PDC CASE NO. 15-045 father expressed concerns to Ms. Tveit concerning alleged inappropriate professional conduct by Mr. Clay, in his capacity as a deputy prosecutor or contracted public defender. Mr. Ghramm engaged the services of Ted Pulver, a private investigator, to investigate the alleged past conduct of Michael Clay, sometime in January 2014. The results of the investigation by Ted Pulver were never used by Ms. Tveit in any manner during her campaign.

- 3. Public Disclosure Commission Staff allege that because Mr. Ghramm's expenditures for investigative services were conducted in consultation with Ms. Tveit, they constituted an inkind contribution to her 2014 general election campaign. Ms. Tveit was therefore required to file a C-1, registering her candidacy, within two weeks of the date she was informed of her father's activities, or by no later than February 13, 2014. She filed a candidate registration on May 24, 2014, 100 days after February 13, 2014. Ms. Tveit disputes these claims.
- 4. After the PDC staff stared a formal investigation and on the recommendation of the PDC staff Ms. Tveit reported the value of Ted Pulver's services as a \$4,500 in-kind contribution from her father for the 2014 primary election. Ms. Tveit did not agree that it was an in-kind contribution but believed that the PDC would drop the matter if she reported the value of the services as an in-kind contribution. Mr. Ghramm's limit to Ms. Tveit's campaign for the 2014 primary election was \$1,800.
- 5. The Campaign received monetary and in-kind contributions totaling \$46,679, with an equal amount of expenditures. Of this amount, Ms. Tveit contributed \$40,207 in personal funds which represented 86.5 percent of all contributions received.
- 6. The Campaign filed its June 2014 C-4 report 32 days late, on August 11, 2014. The report, due July 10, 2014, included expenditures totaling \$6,551, of which \$6,182 was for political advertising materials.
- 7. The Campaign was required to file a C-3 report by October 6, 2014, disclosing receipt of \$24,791 in personal funds from Ms. Tveit on October 1, 2014. The Campaign did not report the contribution until February 2, 2015, 119 days late and nearly three months after the 2014 general election. The late-reported contribution represented 53.1 percent of all contributions received by the Campaign.

- The Campaign failed to timely disclose \$22,113 in direct mail and newspaper political advertising orders on the 21-day pre-general election C-4 report due on October 14, 2014. The orders placed were disclosed 111 days late on February 2, 2015, in a combined C-4 report covering the period of October 14, 2014 through December 10, 2014.
- 9. The Campaign failed to timely file its 7-day Pre-General election C-4 report by October 28, 2014, and its Post-General election C-4 report by December 10, 2014. The 7-day C-4 report was filed 97 days late, and the Post-General election C-4 report was filed 54 days late, both on February 2, 2015. The late reported activities included:
 - 1) A \$24,791 deposit of contributions from Ms. Tveit's personal funds; and
 - 2) \$24,791 in campaign expenditures for political advertising.

These expenditures were reported 97 days late.

- 10. Public Disclosure Commission Staff further allege: that the \$4,500 in-kind contribution received from Mr. Ghramm for the cost of hiring a private investigator to investigate Mr. Clay was reported at least 265 days late; and that \$2,600 in outstanding debts or obligations owed to Mr. Ghramm to repay the over-limit portion of his in-kind contribution was reported late. Ms. Tveit disputes these claims.
- 11. The Campaign filed its C-3 and C-4 reports manually on paper, rather than by the required electronic method. The campaign was required to file electronically because it raised and spent over \$5,000. The Campaign did not request an exemption from the electronic filing requirement, and therefore failed to report electronically.
- 12. Ms. Tveit handled the campaign primarily on her own. She was not familiar with all of the filing requirements. She did not intentionally fail or refuse to file any report and she made a full disclosure of her campaign contributions, mostly self-contributions, and her expenses.
