	interest in the law firm.
	Mr. Vaska states that Foster Garvey follows the American Bar Association
	Formal Opinion 10-457 and does not disclose the names of clients without
	their specific consent, with some preferring not to be disclosed.
	Mr. Vaska states that Foster Garvey does not publish a client list or
	subscribe to services to list client names, though individual attorneys may
	have permission from their clients to be disclosed on web sites and printed
	materials.
	 Mr. Vaska has disclosed most clients for whom he has done legal work
	and is seeking permission from others, but has not disclosed all of the
	clients who are listed in Martindale Hubbell, the firm's resume, website, or
	similar promotional materials.
	Mr. Vaska amended his F-1 report to disclose governmental customers of
